

MENTOR TEACHER or DIRECTOR MENTOR: Which is right for me?

Mentor Teachers supervise college students earning credits as student teachers in an Early Care and Education (ECE) classroom or family child care home.

Director Mentors provide support and guidance to new directors, or experienced directors facing new challenges in administering an ECE center or family child care.

DIRECTOR Mentor Qualifications:

- Three years of ECE supervisory experience,
- Completion of at least three units of ECE Administration/Supervision,
- Completion of a Director Mentor Institute . NOTE: Only individuals who have participated in a DM Info Webinar (2011-12) or a live DM Info Session (previous years) may attend, and
- Application to your local Mentor Program Coordinator (including Program Administration Scale assessment - more information on the PAS requirement is available through the Director Mentor Frequently Asked Questions and at the Information session.).

Mentor TEACHER Qualifications:

- Two years of experience teaching in an ECE environment,
- Current employment in an ECE site (minimum of 3 hrs per day 5 days per week),
- Completion of a degree or certificate in ECE, including at least one course that required observation or student teaching in an ECE classroom,
- A Master Teacher Permit, or higher level, on the Cal. Child Development Permit Matrix,
- Completion of an Adult Supervision (Mentor Teacher) course, and
- Completion of an application, including an appropriate Environment Rating Scale (e.g. ECERS-R, ITERS-R, FCCERS-R) to your local Mentor Program Coordinator.
